SCHOOL ON THE MOVE AWARD CRITERIA

Each spring, EdVestors invites a select group of Boston Public Schools to apply for the School on the Move Prize based on a rigorous quantitative screen using historical and current student achievement data. Schools must demonstrate substantial improvement in student achievement over a four-year period in Math and English Language Arts, and meet additional criteria related to school performance, student demographics, and graduation rates for high schools.

Each year, only 5-10% of Boston Public Schools meet the eligibility criteria and receive invitations to apply for the Prize. Invited schools prepare a written Prize application detailing how they achieved dramatic improvement and outlining the strategies and best practices they employed. EdVestors' Prize Selection Panel reviews applications and conducts site visits to the three finalist schools before announcing the winner at our annual Prize Ceremony.

The School on the Move Prize complements EdVestors' ongoing work to help more schools create conditions for significant improvement.
