



SCHOOL ON THE MOVE PRIZE AWARD CRITERIA



OVERVIEW

Each fall, the School on the Move Prize recognizes one of the most improving Boston Public Schools. Acknowledging the tremendous effort needed to ensure every student in Boston receives a world-class education, we seek to shine a light on those schools, leaders, and teachers who create and continuously improve learning environments where all students thrive, demonstrated through significantly improved outcomes for students.

Like many aspects of our lives over the past year, the 2021 Prize will be different in a few ways. We opened this year's invitation to apply to many formerly eligible schools from over the past five years of the Prize. We're interested in learning how Boston's most improving schools have used their foundation of strong practices to pivot during the pandemic and the disruptions it brought to our education systems. In excavating lessons learned from the past year of remote and hybrid learning, our goal is to spotlight key levers to aid the recovery and reimagining of learning in the coming years.

The sixteenth annual \$100,000 Prize will be awarded to one winning school in fall 2021 following a thorough quantitative and qualitative review conducted by EdVestors. Two runners up each receive a \$10,000 award.

F. LYMAN WINSHIP ELEMENTARY SCHOOL 2020 SCHOOL ON THE MOVE PRIZE WINNER

The Winship is a small elementary school located just behind Brighton Center. Their student population reflects more than 35 different countries and almost half speak a language other than English at home.

The school focuses on providing students with education through STEAM-based experiences. They credit their improvement to revamping their school pedagogy, emphasizing student-centered learning. The Winship moved to school-wide implementation of classroom practices that adopt rigorous, student-centered learning opportunities that are engaging and meet the current and diverse needs of the school community.
